1. CRRA Pilot Project Resource-Sharing Initiative

Membership Committee is looking for volunteers to join a 4-month pilot project the objective of which is to assist users in accessing materials in CRRA member and partner collections. This service will be free of charge among CRRA members and partners, it is not meant as a substitute for members' existing consortial borrowing services, but rather to provide access to unique materials not readily available elsewhere. The pilot will run from late-February through May 2018.

CRRA members will continue borrowing from their current "first line" borrowing partners, usually a state or other consortial resource-sharing network. Participants in the CRRA resource sharing will add CRRA members to their list of borrowing partners and when requesting, identify themselves in a note field as belonging to CRRA. Members and partners will participate based on their capacity for loaning and/or digitizing, and to the extent possible, share resources with CRRA members free of charge. OCLC membership is not required. Participants can use ILLiad, Tipasa, email or web submissions for requesting materials. We encourage keeping statistics of CRRA transactions in order to measure the impact of this pilot project.

2. Archdiocese of Philadelphia announces New Archives Director (Cait Kokolus)

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia announces that Leslie O'Neill has been appointed Archives Director at the Catholic Historical Research Center (CHRC), the new archives for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The collections also include the records of the American Catholic Historical Society (ACHS) and the archives of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, including St. Katherine Drexel's papers. Leslie comes to the CHRC from the University of Pennsylvania Law Library Archives.
