3. Round robin discussion on what the CRRRA and the portal should be doing in five years – Lorraine (40 minutes)

Discussion of individual visions for the CRRRA and the portal in the framework of content and community

Content

- True access to content, not just discovery, not much future otherwise
 - through hard copy or e-document delivery such as scanned images on request
 - links to full digital content
 - Clicking through EAD’s for services, access to content
 - “Thumbnails” of audio, visual content on the portal
 - Create a full digital content repository hospitable to all formats of resources
 - Host full content on the portal centrally if/as needed by individual institutions
 - Other institutions might host their full content locally; also put their full content on the portal?
- Continuing emphasis on identifying at-risk rare, unique or archival Catholic materials and enable/support preservation of such materials
 - through individual or collaborative initiatives
 - preserve digital copies on the portal
- Make it easy and attractive to contribute content. Demonstrate value to scholars with 3 “critical mass” collections relevant to scholars as demonstration projects
- If go in direction of full content repository, retain focus on rare, unique and archival Catholic sources
- Need clear collection development policy for explaining scope to members and scholars

Community - Members

- Providing rich discovery service for Catholic materials that includes context, relationship
- Providing targeted support to members to improve metadata, make more full text resources available
- Provide tools to members to help them create rich metadata, pursue grant opportunities, and collaborate on digitization and description efforts
- Targeted support to membership for enhancing their metadata
 - Make it easy and attractive to contribute content. Begin with a major “call to contribute” content (metadata and/or full content) around specified themes to create critical mass collections to make portal as “go to place” for scholars”
- Alliances

Community - Scholars

For scholars – tools, in inaugural or biennial conference on tools, repository

- Access to archivists, librarians for assistance on exploring extent of collections, opportunities
- Tools for pedagogy, which could include aggregated “libguides” for how to research key topics from lots of institutions, a way to open up the content
- Data mining, text mining tools for analysis across aggregation of sources
- The starting place for scholars to find out what has been done, links to other researchers
- Opportunities to enhance the resource with additional descriptions, links, etc.
- Showcase examples, such as how University of Virginia E-Text Center (1992, now in Scholars Lab) encouraged graduate students and professors to create digital projects for their classes, Walt Whitman Project which was done in tandem with a research support entity for Advanced Technology in the Humanities – for the portal, could consider using some projects as a model to inspire others ; also a support structure for scholars or students to use various tools for doing such projects
- Fellowships, or perhaps support through models, for scholarship using rare, unique or archival Catholic sources

Scholars:

1. Providing scholars a place to interact, discuss, collaborate (collaborator)
 2. Sponsoring at least an inaugural annual or biannual conference
 3. Providing tool kit to scholars to further analyze and use resources in portal
