3. St. John's University Archives, Digital Collections

The Department of University Archives & Special Collections at St. John's University, New York is in the process of digitizing Catholic history materials. Now available online is the <u>Halpern</u> <u>Collection of Popes and Saints Letters</u>, a group of autographed letters from thirty-six popes and four saints of the Catholic Church, dating from 1256 to 1946. The <u>Thomas F. Meehan Catholic History Collection</u> will be the next addition to the <u>digital collections</u> website, some of which is already uploaded. Several historical and current student and university publications from St. John's University are now online as well.
