### **2. CRRA webinar on reciprocal resource-sharing**

The Membership Committee is proposing a reciprocal resource sharing agreement be set up to open doors for easier borrowing of materials discovered in the portal. On December 7, the Committee explored what opportunities there might be for encouraging reciprocal resource sharing among CRRA members on a meeting-webinar. Even though a short notice, 18 members joined the webinar to discuss questions of current resource sharing activities in their libraries, mechanics, capacity, and interest of members on this option. ### **3. CRRA Catholic Newspapers Map**

CRRA webmaster, Josh Dinsman, has added a new feature to the CRRA website: a map providing a visual representation of the papers included in our list of [Catholic Newspapers Online](#) (CNO).

The link at the top of the [CNO page](#) directs interested parties to the map. When you go to the map, clicking on an icon brings up a sidebar within the map that lists the name and location of the paper, as well as a link to where the paper can be accessed online. The visual overview that you get when first open the map really shows the coverage we've been able to achieve.

Thanks to your help in identifying papers, there are now *over 200 papers* listed. Have a look! If you know of others to add, please let us know and also alert your users to this resource by linking to it from your website.

##### **4a. CLIR Six-Week Webinar Series: Strategies for Advancing Hidden Collections**

The Council on Library and Information Resources (CLIR) announced the opening of registration for a new practical education project: [Strategies for Advancing Hidden Collections \(SAHC\)](#). The project includes six 90-minute webinars and an [online resource library](#) presenting techniques and best practices for increasing the visibility, usability, and sustainability of collections in the GLAM (Gallery, Library, Archive, and Museum) communities. The series will be especially relevant for organizations with limited funding and resources but will be applicable to all collecting institutions. All webinars will take place from 2:00-3:30 pm ET and are offered free of charge. Sessions will function as a series, and we request that those interested in live viewing be available for the entire series. Live participation will be limited to the first 100 respondents. Recordings will be made available shortly after the conclusion of each session.
