July 2009-June 2010

(8 +3 members)

Build infrastructure: in terms of the portal, collections,
and membership

- Adopted and implemented VuFind
- Established, documented, and communicated best practices for members to make content available
- Ingested more than 20,000 records as part of a pilot project
- Conducted focus groups at six member institutions to determine scope of content
- Identified 12 themes; developed *Collection Policy*
- Submitted a successful CLIR grant with three member institutions

July 2010-June 2011

Develop a portal rich in rare, unique and uncommon resources with a robust search and display functionality for MARC and EAD

- Refined portal content by focusing on rare, unique, and uncommon
- Implemented VuFind 1.0
- Developed an EAD viewer and indexer
